



Mr. Kenneth James Westfall

Mr. Kenneth James “Ken” Westfall, age 81, of Dallas, GA, died Friday morning, December 12, 2014, at his residence.

Mr. Westfall was born on April 30, 1933, in Richwood, West Virginia, the son of the late Clyde and Lillian Nash Westfall. He was a veteran of the United States Air Force having served during the Korean Conflict. For a number of years Mr. Westfall was associated with Lockheed and Martin-Douglas Companies. In his later years, he was a self-employed contract painter. Mr. Westfall loved gardening, where he raised roses and tomatoes. He also was an avid hunter and fisherman. In addition to his parents, Mr. Westfall was preceded in death by three brothers and three sisters.
